Market Highlights

- October sales of 577 units were up by 38.0% versus last year as the cumulative effect of four consecutive Bank of Canada rate cuts had a material effect on volume
- New listings (+5.9%) and total active listings (+20.4%) were also up but by a much lesser degree
- Despite apparent tighter market conditions as compared to October 2023, the average price of \$1,081,951 retreated slightly by 2.2% versus last year
- Volume is expected to continue its aggressive recovery given further anticipated Bank of Canada rate cuts and positive changes to mortgage lending guidelines



Load-bearing walls 101

You may have heard the term 'load-bearing wall' from construction workers or homeowners, but what does it actually mean? A load-bearing wall is a structural wall that supports other elements of the building, like the roof or upper floors. This weight is transferred to the foundation of the property and, unlike other non-load-bearing walls that serve to partition or divide spaces, load-bearing walls are essential to the stability of the building.

How to tell if you have one

While exterior walls always tend to be load-bearing, interior walls can be tougher to spot. Often, walls located in the centre of the house are load-bearing as well as ones that run perpendicular to the floor or ceiling joists. If you're unsure, try checking for visible beams or columns, as walls that connect with these are likely load-bearing. You can also consult your blueprints or building plans — load-bearing

walls tend to be marked with thicker or double lines. Consult a professional if you're at all unsure, especially if you are considering removing a load-bearing wall.

Are they necessary?

Load-bearing walls are critical to the stability of a home and should not be altered without adequate planning. If you're thinking of remodeling your home, it's important to identify load-bearing walls before beginning the project. An alternate support system must be put in its place temporarily to transfer the weight, and then permanent replacement beams, studs, or posts will later need to be installed.

Can you remove it and what is the cost?

Load-bearing walls can almost always be removed, though you will need to obtain permits from your local authority first. It can be a lengthy and costly process but creating open plan spaces in your home can be transformative. The cost can vary from \$5,000 to \$20,000 to remove a load-bearing wall, but it will depend on the size and scope of the overall project.
